Bus subsidy cuts

Councillor Barrie Day has attended meetings over the last two months re the cuts to services. The PC is working with Cumbria County Council to try and minimise the cuts.

Service 47 : Anthorn – Kirkbride - Newton Arlosh – Wigton (Tuesday only) changes to this service have still to be confirmed

Cumbria Foster Carers

What is fostering?

Fostering is a way of providing a family life for children who cannot live with their own parents. Often children will return home once the problems that caused them to come into foster care have been resolved and that it is clear that their parents are able to look after them safely. Others may stay in long-term foster care, some may be adopted, and others will move on to live independently.

Who are the children?

There are around 600 children in foster care, of all ages (0-18 years of age) and from various cultural and social backgrounds, who are placed in foster care for many different reasons. About 20% of children placed last year were under 1 year old, almost 50% were 5 years or younger. Around 16% were aged between 14 and 15 years. They have a variety of unique needs and our carers, are required to provide a safe, healthy and nurturing environment and give these children the opportunity to live their life to the full.

Parish Updates

Pot Holes: all households should have received information about the resurfacing work scheduled to take place in the first week of September.

Seats on Footpaths: a number of seats have been bought to enhance the Parish Paths network; they will be installed in the Autumn.

New Bridle Bridge: this is being installed across the Wampool on the signposted bridleway from the Anthorn road, and meeting up with the Whitriglees road.

Village Website: Kirkbride Community and Energy Co-operative are in the process of setting up a Kirkbride Village website, it's part of the Energy Hub proposal that was funded by the Big Lottery award. The group would welcome any volunteer support with this initiative. The original group of volunteers who support Jenni Tuck the oil coordinator are also keen for new group members to extend the fuel buying and community based initiatives. They are holding their first AGM on 4.9.14 at 6.30pm in Kirkbride Learning Centre and invite everyone to attend.

Speeding: this continues to be a concern. At one of his recent drop in events, Duncan Fairburn and Caroline discussed the possibility of a group of Parishioners helping to gather information about speeding. Again, please contact Caroline at the KLC if you would like further details.

Grass Cutting: earlier this year there was a problem with cutting grass on the area in front of The Lees and Beech Lee. This land is not owned by the Parish Council and the cutting of this grass is not the responsibility of the PC. It seems that the grass was cut in the past by Home Housing but the ownership of the land is being investigated by them.

Litter Picking: several successful litter picks took place from September to May and the village certainly benefitted from the tidy up. This season the group are hoping to pick from November to April, if you would be able to help with the litter picks which usually happen on the first Sunday of the month at 10 am, please contact Ann Kirk on 51614.

Dog Fouling: Please will dog owners clean up their dog's mess? Bags are available from the village shop and there are several bins around the village, or take it home and put it in your own bin.
